



Dennis Cuneo is a former Senior Vice President at Toyota. He played a key role in the start-up and expansion of Toyota's manufacturing operations in North America.

After retiring from Toyota in 2006, he formed a consulting firm which advises companies seeking to build new HQ, R&D and manufacturing facilities. His clients range from tech startups to large multinational corporations. He has advised several regional economic development agencies and the Province of Ontario on economic development. He is also a part time Partner at Fisher Phillips, a national law firm with over 600 attorneys in 38 offices across the country.

Dennis has served on over 20 governing boards, including two Fortune 500 companies, several universities (one of which he chaired), a Federal Reserve Bank, a stock exchange, a major league stadium authority, a leading automotive think tank, national and regional trade associations, and nonprofit organizations. He held gubernatorial appointments in California, Kentucky, and Mississippi. He has given over 100 talks on the auto industry and economic development.

Dennis currently serves on the advisory boards of two private equity firms which focus on mobility start-ups.
